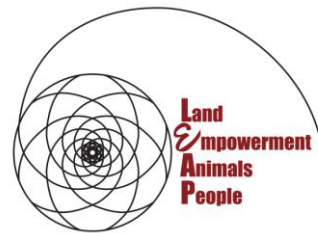

# INTRODUCTION

The Bornean Sun Bear Conservation Centre (BSBCC) is a sun bear rescue and rehabilitation facility being developed in Sabah, Malaysian Borneo. Malayan sun bears are found only in Southeast Asia and are classified as vulnerable by the IUCN Red Book Listing of Endangered Species and are included on Appendix I of CITES. In Sabah, these bears continue to be threatened by forest degradation and habitat loss, illegal hunting for bear parts and protect crops, and poaching to obtain young cubs for the pet trade. As a result of these threats, young sun bears can be found living in unnatural and solitary captive conditions in Sabah, with no access to outdoor areas. The goal of BSBCC is to promote Malayan sun bear conservation by:

- (1) creating the capacity to confiscate, rehabilitate and release suitable orphaned and ex-captive bears that cannot be released back into the wild
- (2) providing an improved long-term living environment for captive bears that cannot be released, and
- (3) educating the public and raising awareness about this little known species through visitor programmes, outreach and support for further research

## Project background

The BSBCC was established as a not for profit organization in Sabah in 2008. It is a joint project between sun bear researcher Wong Siew Te, Land Empowerment Animals People (LEAP), the Sabah Wildlife Department (SWD) and the Sabah Forestry Department (SFD).

The project consists of a two-stage effort to provide for the care, rehabilitation and release of orphaned and captive sun bears, as well as much needed education and awareness for the species.

### 1<sup>st</sup> stage

To build a new bear rescue facility (BSBCC) to house and rehabilitate rescued bears in their natural habitat with an affiliated visitor centre to provide education and awareness about these bears

### 2<sup>nd</sup> stage

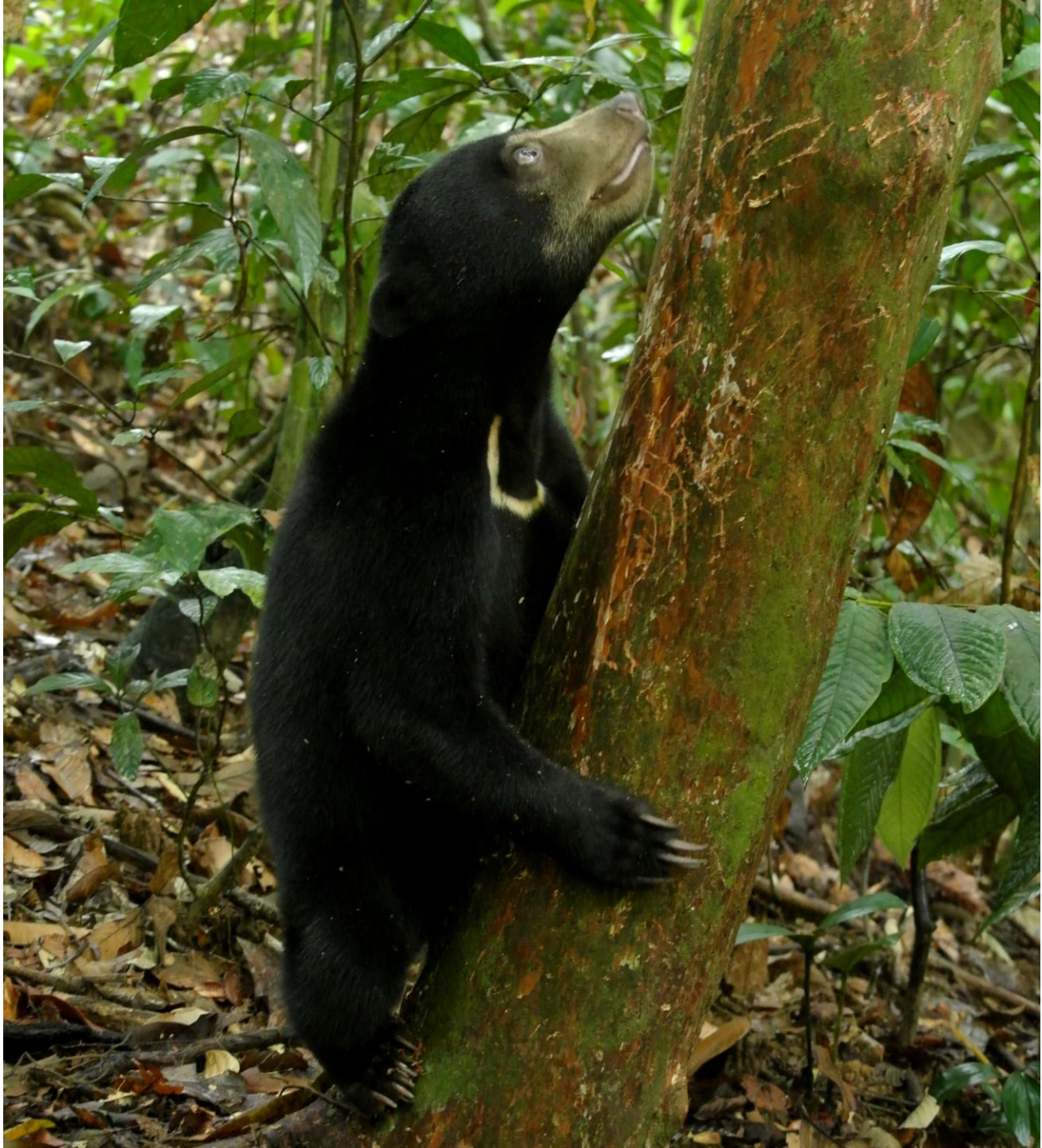
To identify and set up a forest release site for those captive bears that have been evaluated and found suitable for return to the wild. This stage includes initial surveys of protected forest areas, such as Tabin Wildlife Reserve, Deramakot Forest Reserve, Danum Valley Conservation Area and Ulu Segama-Malua Forest Reserve, to determine existing populations and carrying capacities as well as the protection status. Once a site is identified, a small facility consisting of large forest enclosures will be constructed to allow for short-term care of the bears during soft release back into the forest and to allow for post-release monitoring and research

The BSBCC facility is located directly adjacent to the world-renowned Sepilok Orang Utan Rehabilitation Centre (SOURC) in Sandakan, Sabah, on the site of an old bear house and a former rhino enclosure provided by SWD, along with several hectares of adjacent forest provided to the project by the SFD. The Centre includes large forest enclosures in existing primary forest in order to provide a natural environment better suited to the needs and welfare of the bears and facilitate the rehabilitation, training and return of individuals to the wild. Sun bear mothers spend the first 2-3 years of their cub's life teaching survival skills. The Centre will aim to reach these skills to orphaned/ex-captive bears before they are reintroduced into the wild. The Centre also aims to provide critical outreach, information and education materials to promote knowledge and awareness of this little known species locally, regionally and internationally and serve as a base for continued sun bear research in Sabah.

The Centre will have capacity for 43 bears, accommodated in two new bear houses and eight large fenced forested enclosures. Constructed of the first bear house, with a capacity of 20 bears, was completed in early 2010, and the bears previously kept in cramped quarters in the old bear house were

successfully moved into the state-of-the-art new facilities. These bears were able to go out into the adjoining forest enclosures and experience their natural habitat again, some after spending many years in small cages. Since then more bears have been brought to the Centre, bringing the total at the end of 2013 to 28.

With funding of MYR 2.1 million received from Yayasan Sime Darby in 2012, construction of the BSBCC visitor centre, new office, bear holding area and second bear house started on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2013. Designed by Arkitek, and constructed by Buildtech Enterprise the visitor centre, new office and bear holding area were successfully completed on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2013, while the second bear house was still under construction by the end of 2013 and expected to be completed in January 2014.

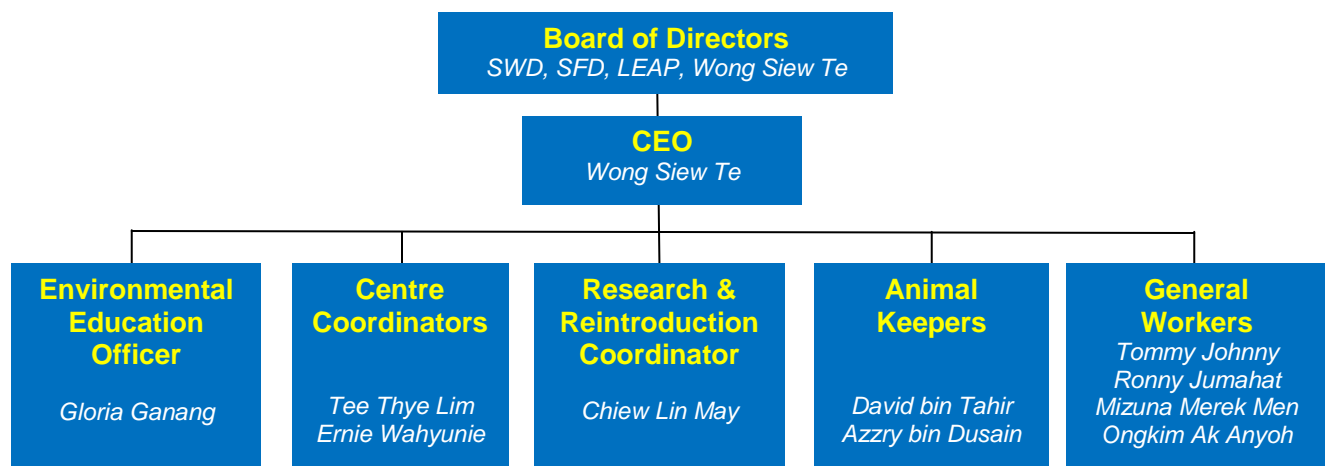

## Staff Development Activities

### Workshop on Animal Husbandry

In achieving the aims of BSBCC in providing an improved long-term living environment for rescued sun bears at the Centre, a workshop on animal husbandry was conducted on 3<sup>rd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> July 2013 by BSBCC Centre Coordinator Tee Thye Lim. The workshop was attended by all BSBCC staff and volunteers.

### Nikon Photography Workshop

A workshop on photography organized by Nikon Malaysia was attended by two BSBCC staff, Tee Thye Lim and Chiew Lin May on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2013.

### Staff Retreat

In preparation for BSBCC's upcoming 6<sup>th</sup> year of operation and beyond, a retreat was held at the Rainforest Discovery Centre on 8<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup> October 2013 to discuss staff issues and the future vision and direction of BSBCC's work. The retreat was facilitated by Cynthia Ong, Founder and Executive Director of LEAP, and was attended by BSBCC and LEAP staff.

# SUN BEARS

## Bear Arrivals in 2013

There were no new bear arrivals in 2013 due to full capacity in the first bear house and the new bear holding area and second bear house being under construction. The total number of bears at the Centre remained at 28 by the end of 2013.

## Health Checks

Annual health checks were conducted on all resident bears at BSBCC in 2013 by SWD Wildlife Rescue Unit veterinarian Dr. Diana Ramirez and veterinarian Dr. Nigel Hicks of Sepilok Orang Utan Appeal UK.

## Bear Training & Introduction to Forest Enclosures

BSBCC staff conducted electric fence training on all the bears that were released to the forest enclosures. By the end of 2013, a total of 25 bears (7 males and 18 females) were being released daily into the enclosures, where the bears started to perform natural activities in their forest habitat, and were often seen climbing, resting, foraging and making nests. The remaining sun bears (1 male and 2 females) will go through electric fence training before being released to the forest enclosures in 2014.

## Enrichment

Bears were also equipped with different types of enrichment in their indoor cages. Enrichment items provided were donated, made by groups visiting the Centre or custom made by BSBCC staff and volunteers.

## Sun Bear Reintroduction Activities

A team comprising staff from BSBCC and SWD Wildlife Rescue Unit (WRU) visited Tabin Wildlife Reserve in south east Sabah from 13<sup>th</sup> -16<sup>th</sup> June and 15<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> October 2013 to check whether the area is a possible future release site for rehabilitated sun bears. Five camera traps were set up in different parts of the Reserve to start gathering information on the resident sun bear population and other wildlife. A photo of a sub adult sun bear was captured on 28<sup>th</sup> August 2013.

# VOLUNTEERS

## Bear Action Teams (BATs) Volunteer Groups

The BATs programme continued to run successfully throughout 2013 with a total of 5 groups (74 individuals) participating from Camps International and Outlook Expeditions (*See Appendix I*).

The project for the BATs volunteer programme was to build a 340m perimeter boardwalk for the proposed new forest enclosure that surrounds the second bear house. Building work was supervised by architect intern from Arkitrek, Jonathan Dolan.

## Individual Volunteers

Individual volunteers continued to play an important role at BSBCC, assisting with enrichment, feeding and cleaning, maintenance and education. They are also important ambassadors especially in promoting awareness of sun bears in their respective countries. A total of 14 individual volunteers from 6 countries worked at BSBCC in 2013, out of a grand total of 99 individual volunteers who have contributed to the Centre since its establishment (*See Appendix II*).

## Paying Volunteer Programme

BSBCC launched a volunteer programme via Ecoteer (Malaysia) Sdn Bhd in May 2013. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between BSBCC and Ecoteer for a one year collaboration in promoting the BSBCC volunteer programme, where volunteers pay a donation to BSBCC, as well as for food and accommodation. By the end of 2013, two volunteers had signed up for the programme, helping mostly with bear husbandry work and landscaping. Besides assisting in continuously having volunteers to help the operations of BSBCC, the volunteer programme also helped in supporting BSBCC financially.



# INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

## Visitor Centre, Office & Bear Holding Area

In preparation for BSBCC's opening to the public in 2014, construction of the visitor centre, office and new bear holding area started on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2013. The SWD old clinic was redesigned as the BSBCC visitor centre and office. The existing bear holding area was improved and refurbished with the addition of a food preparation area. During this construction phase, BSBCC temporarily used an office provided by SOURC before moving back to the completed new office at the end of October 2013.

## Second Bear House

The second bear house was constructed adjacent to the first bear house, comprising 16 more bear cages, a food preparation area, food storage room and equipment store room. The construction, which also commenced on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2013, was nearing completion by the end of the year. In addition to the existing forest enclosure, another one hectare of forest was allocated by SFD for sun bears to access from the second bear house, however funding was still insufficient to build fences and hot wires around the new forest enclosure.

## Gateway Entrance

Construction of the main public entrance to BSBCC, a gateway located near the SOURC car park, was started in December 2013 and carried out by Buildtech. The gateway, designed by Arkitrek and funded through SWD, features sheltered seating areas and space for informative signage which will be completed in early 2014.

## Landscaping

The landscaping of the area round the BSBCC visitor centre also played an important part in getting the centre ready for the public in 2014. BSBCC was privileged to have the opportunity to work with a Singapore based landscape design company called Salad Dressing, which voluntarily provided expertise and consultation for BSBCC's landscaping. By the end of 2013, a welcoming garden in front of the visitor centre was created, providing an inviting atmosphere for visitors arriving at BSBCC.

# INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE

## Removal of leaning dead tree

A dead belian tree that was leaning near the perimeter fencing of the sun bear forest enclosures was removed by SFD staff on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2013. The felled belian tree was reused as building material for the new visitor centre.

## Temporary trail for visitor access

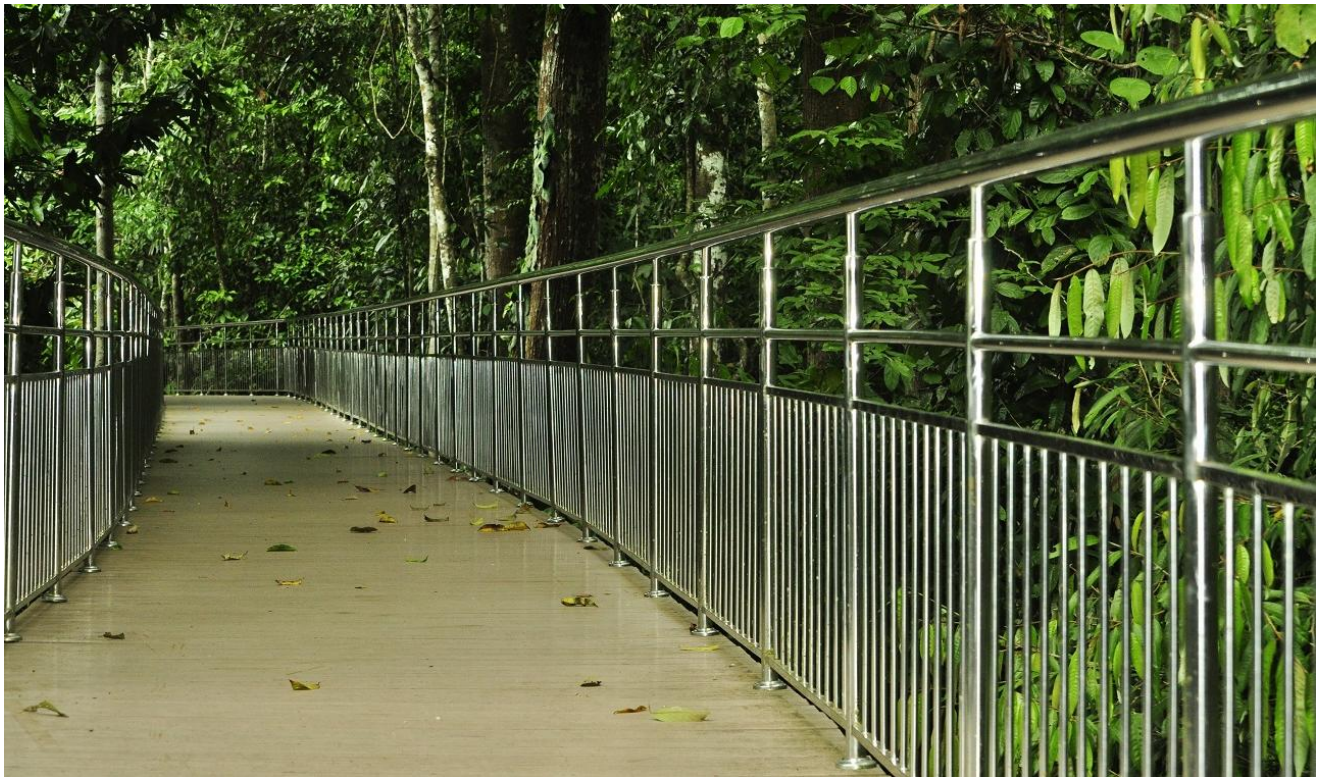
While the visitor centre was still under construction, a temporary trail was constructed in May 2013 to connect the existing access walkway with the observation platform. This enabled occasional visitors to see the sun bears at the observation platform, and allowed educational activities to run uninterrupted throughout the year at BSBCC.

## Fallen tree branches

Broken tree branches on perimeter fencing and bear house buildings occurred occasionally throughout the year. The fallen branches were immediately removed by BSBCC staff to avoid the bears climbing out from the forest enclosures and allow repair work on the facilities.

## Additional bar on handrails

An additional bar was attached between the top and lower rungs of the observation platform boardwalk handrail in November 2013. This was due to safety concerns that the gap was too big and possible for children to climb through.

# FINANCIAL SUMMARY

## Funding

BSBCC received funding from various organizations and individuals throughout 2013, including Yayasan Sime Darby, Sabah Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Environment, Neways International Pty Ltd, Seaworld Busch Gardens Conservation Trust and GEF Small Grants Programme. This funding enabled the second bear house and visitor centre to be constructed for BSBCC to house more rescued bears and open to the public in early 2014. ## Fundraising

### Zumba for sun bear

A Zumba event was organized by Zumba instructor, Madam Fay de Vera at the Sabah Hotel, Sandakan on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2013, which raised a total of MYR 6,888 through ticket sales. BSBCC Founder and CEO, Mr. Wong Siew Te gave a short talk about sun bears and BSBCC put up an educational booth during the event.

### Big Dreams Little Bears

A fundraising event “Big Dreams Little Bears” was held on 20<sup>th</sup> July 2013 at the Hakka Association Hall, Sandakan. An organizing committee comprising local Sandakan citizens and BSBCC staff contributed to the success of the event which was attended by over 700 people and raised a total of MYR 446, 550. A series of articles on BSBCC and the event came out in the local press, written by LEAP’s Communications Manager Jaswinder Kler. BSBCC’s Project Manager, Ng Wai Pak was interviewed by NTV7 in Kuala Lumpur about the event.

On the day after the event, 300 students from 10 local schools were invited to a free screening of the documentary “Big Dreams Little Bears”, to help raise awareness of sun bears and BSBCC. This event was held at the Sabah Hotel, Sandakan, and also featured special appearances by international artists Gary Chao and Pink Tan.

## Other Corporate Initiatives & Affiliations

### Sabah Hotel, Sandakan

BSBCC benefitted from a corporate partnership with Sabah Hotel, Sandakan under an MoU which was signed in early 2013. Stories of sun bears and the work of BSBCC including BSBCC videos were promoted through a display booth at the hotel lobby and guests could make contributions through a donation box. Videos were also shown on the hotel's in-house TV.

### University of the Sunshine Coast, Queensland, Australia

An MOU was signed between the University of the Sunshine Coast (USC), Queensland, Australia and BSBCC on 19th May 2013. The USC proposed to work with BSBCC on research, academic and conservation activities such as field courses, as well as education and outreach activities. USC sent two Environmental Science students for their internship at BSBCC; students from the USC Faculty of Arts and Business started working on designing educational panels for BSBCC and Public Relations students began working on the Sun Bear Adoption Programme for BSBCC to be launched in 2014.

### Neways International

Neways International Australia, a multi-level marketing company, gave their support to BSBCC through a donation of AUD 10,000 during their celebration of individual and business successes in Sabah through the Neways Diamond Adventure. BSBCC Founder and CEO, Wong Siew Te delivered a talk about sun bears to Neways International Australia members in Kota Kinabalu on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2013, before the members made a visit to the Centre the next day.

### I Lan University, Taiwan

A Statement of Cooperation was signed on 6<sup>th</sup> December 2014 between BSBCC and National Ilan University, College of Bioresources, during a visit of several professors from the university to the Centre. The Institutions will explore areas of potential collaboration with respect to the following activities: (a) Exchanging professional information and experience (b) Cooperative education (c) Extension service and education (d) Other activities deemed appropriate by mutual consent.

## Oakland Zoo Borneo Expedition

On 10<sup>th</sup> November 2013, a team of 15 members from Oakland Zoo comprising staff and volunteers arrived at BSBCC for a 3-day voluntary programme. Several activities were arranged for the team to help out BSBCC including sun bear husbandry, landscaping, consultation discussion and sun bear behavior observation. Besides sharing their time and energy, the Oakland Zoo team also brought some t-shirts for the staff and enrichment materials for the sun bears.

# PUBLIC AWARENESS

## Blogs, Website & Facebook

### Sun Bear Blog

The Bornean Sun Bear blog, [sunbears.wildlifedirect.org](http://sunbears.wildlifedirect.org) which was started by Wong in May 2008, continued to run successfully throughout 2013. Contributions to the blog were made by the BSBCC team and individual volunteers, providing a lively and up to date chronicle of the development of BSBCC. The blog also served as a means to spread information and awareness about sun bear conservation in general.

### Website

BSBCC's website on [www.bsbcc.org.my](http://www.bsbcc.org.my) was launched in 2013. The website features information and news updates about sun bears as well as BSBCC's operations. Information on how people can help through BSBCC volunteer programme and online donations was also available on the website.

### BSBCC Facebook page

BSBCC facebook page which was launched in 2012 was continuously updated throughout 2013. Articles and photos on sun bears and the Centre's activities were regularly posted on the page to update BSBCC's supporters on the development of BSBCC.

## Filming Groups

Several film companies visited BSBCC during 2013. Australian film company H2O Productions filmed the sun bears at BSBCC on 18<sup>th</sup> April; Japanese film company NHK filmed at BSBCC from 11<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> July, covering sun bear behaviour in the wild for the programme "Borneo Hotspot", and RTM, a Malaysian TV station, conducted filming entitled "I Got It" from 26<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> September 2013, focusing on the work of BSBCC in rehabilitating sun bears. Sabah-based film company Scubazoo visited BSBCC on 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2013, interviewing Wong and filming the sun bears. Scubazoo will produce a short video and other footage which will be available offline and online for marketing and educational purposes by both Scubazoo and BSBCC and Astro Ria, a Malaysian TV station, did a 1-day film shoot at BSBCC on 27<sup>th</sup> October 2013.

## Newspaper & TV Coverage & Live Interviews

### Newspaper Coverage

BSBCC's Project Manager Ng Wai Pak was interviewed live on NTV7 The Breakfast Show on 19<sup>th</sup> July 2013. During the interview, Wai Pak spoke about the story of Fulung, one of the rescued sun bears at BSBCC that was kept illegally as a pet before being brought to the Centre.

# EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

## Educational visits to BSBCC

Educational activities were conducted throughout the year to continuously spread awareness about sun bears and their conservation. A total of 1,228 people from various local and international schools and organizations visited the Centre in 2013 (See Appendix IV).

## Skype talk with Stuart Point Pre School, Australia

Stuarts Point Pre School, Australia initiated a “Sun Bear Project” which aims to raise awareness of the tremendous efforts of BSBCC and to make the little known sun bear famous in Stuarts Point and Scotts Head. The preschool held sessions introducing the children to sun bears and the work of BSBCC in helping to save the sun bears. They also did a “Sun Bear Fundraiser” by selling cakes at their school. On 4<sup>th</sup> March 2013, the children had a “Skyping the sun bears” experience where BSBCC’s Founder and CEO, Wong Siew Te had a live talking session with the children at the observation platform.

On 30<sup>th</sup> October 2013, SFD organized the EE Race HoB 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition aimed at raising awareness on environmental issues among school teachers through experiential learning. BSBCC was one of the venues of the race, where the participants conducted hands-on activities entitled “Bear Keeper for a Day.” The aim

of this exercise was to allow the participants to understand the importance of good animal husbandry for captive animals and their welfare. The activity also featured a special session with BSBCC’s Founder and CEO, Wong Siew Te, where participants were taught about the ecology of sun bears as well as important roles the Centre plays in protecting sun bears.
